Lead Mentor Handbook

This is where you'll find all the information you need to know about the process of Lead Mentoring.

Before Mentoring

You will receive an Excel spreadsheet containing the following information about your mentors:

- Name
- What they prefer to be called
- Pronouns
- University
- Type (new or returning)
- Which cycles they've signed up for
- Contact details (uni and personal email, telephone number)
- Preferred method of contact

Please get in touch with mentors via university email to start off with, then establish what method they'd like you to use when you check in with them. If they don't respond after a week, then you can start using other methods of contact. Please let Georgie know if they're unresponsive after two weeks.

You can use the email template to introduce yourself to your mentors.

In your first check in ahead of mentoring, please check the following with them:

- Have they done their **DBS check** via STEM Ambassadors?
- Have they joined the Discord?
- Have they signed the Mentor Agreement?

During Mentoring

Once mentors have been matched to schools, we will send you an updated spreadsheet to include the following information:

- Mentoring format
- Have they joined the Discord?
- Have they signed the Agreement?
- Have they had their initial meeting?

You can then tailor your next check-in around this information.

Please note: a "No" under initial meeting doesn't necessarily mean they haven't done anything yet. It may be that they've emailed, or a date is arranged but they haven't had the meeting yet.

Each week during a mentoring cycle, the project team will send you a list of mentors in your group who **haven't** completed their reflection forms. Please either remind them during their check-in, or contact them if you have no check-in scheduled and remind them to complete reflections.

Post Mentoring

Once mentoring is complete, you are welcome to have some post-mentoring check-ins with your mentors if they wish to see how it went.

This may also be a good time to start contacting your Cycle 10 mentors about check-ins ahead of February.
